In accordance with Public Act 99-0634 (SB 2994), Ogle County submits the following report to the Illinois General Assembly on its appointed local public entities.

## COUNTY APPOINTED PUBLIC ENTITIES

### 911 Emergency Telephone System Board

<b>Location:</b>	202 S 1 <sup>st</sup> Street, Oregon, Illinois
<b>Service Description:</b>	ETSB – means Emergency Telephone System Board appointed by the corporate authorities of any county or municipality that provides for the management and operation of 9-1-1 system.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	The Ogle County 911 ETSB is composed of 9 members – Representatives consist of: 4 Fire/EMS, 1 County Board, 1, Rochelle PSAP, 1 Law Enforcement, 1 Citizen at Large, 1 Sheriff designee.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	Established by referendum in the March 20, 1990 Election.
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	All surcharges excluding the City of Chicago are remitted to the ISP 911 Department. Then the department distributes to systems. The surcharge for all entities outside of the City of Chicago is .87 cents per device. For Prepaid Wireless it is 3% of the amount purchased.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>By the new state legislation, Ogle County was not required to consolidate as we only have 2 PSAP's. The legislation is PA 99-0006 and SB96.</i>

### Board of Health

<b>Location:</b>	907 W. Pines Rd, Oregon, Illinois
<b>Service Description:</b>	The Board of Health ensures that all state laws and County Ordinances regarding the preservation of health are upheld through observation and enforcement.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	The Board of Health is composed of 11 members: At least 2 members must be physicians licensed to practice medicine in Illinois, at least 1 member must be a licensed Dentist in Illinois, 2 members must be on the County Board and at least 1 members must have experience in the field of mental health.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	The Ogle County Board of Health was established by resolution on July 9 <sup>th</sup> , 1943. The Board of Health and the Tuberculosis Care and Treatment Board were combined by resolution in June of 1998.
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	The Board of Health receives funding from Ogle County's general fund, a percentage of the tax levy for tuberculosis, state and federal grants, and fee for service.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Board of Review

<b>Location:</b>	105 S 5 <sup>th</sup> St #215, Oregon, Illinois
<b>Service Description:</b>	The Board of Review is a quasi-judicial agency established by state statute with the intent of providing property owners with an informal venue to resolve assessed value disputes. The Board of Review does not have the authority to directly change actual property tax bills.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	The Board of Review consists of 3 citizens of Ogle County.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	The Board of Review was established in accordance with the Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/6-5 to 6-55).
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	The Board of Review is funded through the County's General Fund.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Byron Museum District

<b>Location:</b>	110 N Union, Byron, IL
<b>Service Description:</b>	The Lucius Read House and Byron Museum of History are part of the Byron Museum District in Byron, Illinois. Since its organization in the early 1990s, the Museum strives to preserve Byron's rich local and area history.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	The Byron Museum District has five appointed commissioners.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	Established by referendum in the March 20, 1990 Election via Illinois Museum Act 70 ILCS 1105
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	The Byron Museum District receives its funding from Property Taxes.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Civic Center Authority Board

<b>Location:</b>	112 N 7 <sup>th</sup> St, Rochelle, Illinois
<b>Service Description:</b>	Ogle County Civic Center Authority are stewards of the Hickory Grove Civic Center, is to manage facilities for cultural, recreational, educational, social and community activities for the citizens of Ogle County.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	The Civic Center Authority Board consists of 9 board members.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	Established through the Metropolitan Civic Center Act through a County Board Resolution dated August 9, 1983,
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	Tax-Exempt – Non-Taxing Body
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Farmland Assessment Review Board

<b>Location:</b>	105 S 5 <sup>th</sup> St #215, Oregon, Illinois
<b>Service Description:</b>	The Farmland Assessment Review Committee is established by state statute for the purpose of reviewing and acting on Annual proposed Farmland Assessments from the Illinois Department of Revenue.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	The Board consists of 5 members: Chief County Assessment Officer or designee, Chairman of the County Board of Review or another member of that board appointed by the Chairman, and 3 farmers appointed by the Ogle County Board.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	35 ILCS 200/10-120
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	Funded through the County General Fund.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Housing Authority

<b>Location:</b>	200 W. Washington St #100, Oregon, Illinois
<b>Service Description:</b>	The Ogle County Housing Authority is responsible for the administration of public programs and funds to improve housing assistance options in Ogle County.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	The Housing Authority consists of 5 board members.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	In 1945, the Ogle County Board unanimously voted to apply to the State Housing Board for the creation of the Ogle County Housing Authority.
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	Ogle County Housing Authority receives ongoing funding from the Federal Government to support public housing in the form of operating funds and capital funds.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Kishwaukee Drainage District

<b>Location:</b>	
<b>Service Description:</b>	The Kishwaukee Drainage District manages farm land drainage ditches and facilities in NE portion of Ogle County and SE Winnebago County.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	The Kishwaukee Drainage District consists of 3 Commissioners appointed by the Ogle County Board.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	1904
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	No property tax – Board periodically assesses land owners within district for maintenance costs based upon benefit to owner’s land.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Kyte River Drainage District

<b>Location:</b>	Law Offices of Fearer, Nye & Chadwick, 420 4th Avenue, Rochelle, IL
<b>Service Description:</b>	The Kyte River Drainage District manages farm land drainage ditches and facilities.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	Kyte River Drainage District consists of 3 Commissioners appointed by the Ogle County Board.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	1914
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	No property tax – Board periodically assesses land owners within district for maintenance costs based upon benefit to owner’s land.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Lost Lake River Conservancy District

<b>Location:</b>	404 Lake Ct, Dixon, IL 61021
<b>Service Description:</b>	We were formed in December 16, 1978 to manage Lost Lake and the dam. Along with this, we manage other RCD owned properties to include 2 beaches, boat racks and landings, various parks and a campground. We have also entered into cooperative agreements with other governmental agencies and private land owners to implement BMP's to help improve the water quality in the Clear Creek watershed. The RCD's taxing district encompasses the property that lies north of Flagg Road from Lost Nation Road on the westerly side to Lowden Road on the easterly side. The northerly side is that of which is the north property line of the golf course extending easterly along the northern edge of the Lost Nation POA property area out to Lowden Road.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	Lost Lake River Conservancy District consists of 5 board members.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	Formed in December 16, 1978
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	They are funded by tax dollars from within their district. The maximum rate which can be extended by the District in any fiscal year for its general corporate purposes is \$.75 per \$100 of the value assessed.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

<b>Location:</b>	202 S 1 <sup>st</sup> Street, Oregon, Illinois
<b>Service Description:</b>	To assist the residents of Ogle County who suffer from mental illness, developmental disabilities or substance abuse/dependency to receive the best professional service.

<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	Established by County Board Resolution dated June 23, 1969
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	Funded through the County General Fund.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>

### Sheriff's Merit Commission

<b>Location:</b>	202 S 1 <sup>st</sup> Street, Oregon, Illinois
<b>Service Description:</b>	Ogle County Sheriff's merit Commission operates pursuant to 55 ILCS 5/3-8001, et al.
<b>Board Composition:</b>	Ogle County Sheriff's Merit Commission is composed of 5 members appointed by the Sheriff and approved by the Ogle County Board.
<b>Origin of Entity:</b>	Established by County Board Ordinance dated June 11, 1973 and effective July 1, 1973 by virtue of Section 859.1, Chapter 34, Illinois Revised Statutes.
<b>Property Tax/Funding:</b>	None. Any compensation to merit Commission is submitted and paid by the Ogle County Board through the General Fund.
<b>Consolidation/ Dissolution Plans:</b>	<i>If applicable</i>
