ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 2020 - 11

Pursuant to Order from the Chief Judge of the 15th Judicial Circuit on April 1, 2020 concerning the COVID-19 Pandemic and therein extending the restrictions limiting court proceedings to emergency essential proceedings through April 30, 2020, the following matters are continued instanter through April 30, 2020 as follows:

CRIMINAL

1. Arraignments to a corresponding date after April 30, 2020.
2. Rochelle Court to a corresponding date after April 30, 2020.
3. April City of Byron cases to June 22, 2020.
4. April 27, 2020 felony jury call: Defendants in custody continued to May 18, 2020. Defendants not in custody as follows:
 - a. Judge Redington's odd numbered felony cases to June 22, 2020 from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.
 - b. Judge Roe's even numbered felony cases to June 29, 2020 from 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 pm..
5. Felony status calls: Continued to a new date after April 30, 2020 by agreement of the State and the defendant's attorney. Pro Se Defendants continued to a new date after April 30, 2020.
6. Thursday bench trial calls: Pro Se Defendants continued to after April 30, 2020 for a status; matters with defense attorneys - to contact the State's Attorneys' Office to continue case to after April 30, 2020.
7. Domestic Violence Court: Arraignments, pretrials and statuses to a corresponding date after April 30, 2020.
8. Drug Court and DUI Court continued to a corresponding date after April 30, 2020.

9. Criminal, civil, family and domestic motions with attorneys currently set will be continued past April 30, 2020. Attorneys are encouraged to agree to a date beyond April 30, 2020. Pro Se litigants will be notified of a new date by the clerk.

CIVIL

1. Civil Calls continued to corresponding date after April 30, 2020.
2. Public Aid Calls continued to date after April 30, 2020.

JUVENILE DELINQUENT (JD) AND ABUSE & NEGLECT CASES

Hearings on detention or removal from home or foster placement in juvenile delinquency and abuse and neglect cases shall be held promptly in accordance with the Juvenile Court Act without delay caused by this Order. Other matters arising from such proceedings shall be reset to dates after April 30, 2020 as directed by the Court.

LIBRARY & RESOURCE ROOM, ETC.

The Library, Resource Room, CASA Room and HOPE Room shall be closed through April 30, 2020.

MATTERS NOT CONTINUED

EMERGENCY MATTERS

1. Petitions for plenary order of protection, plenary order for stalking/no contact, emergency juvenile matters and bonafide emergency child support and parting time/decision making disputes. Determination of a bonafide emergency child support or parenting time/decision making dispute issue shall be determined by the Judge before whom the case is pending. Hearings will be held by video conference if at all possible.
2. Preliminary hearings and bond hearings: Preliminary hearings and bond hearings shall be done by video. Plea agreements will be heard with the consent of the Presiding Judge. In a plea agreement with probation, the defendant shall be directed to contact the probation department by mail.

3. Hearings on detention or removal from home or foster placement in juvenile delinquency and abuse neglect cases.
4. Petitions for voluntary or involuntary admission to an Illinois mental health facility.
6. Petitions to rescind statutory summary suspension of driver's licenses, unless the parties agree to a continuance.
4. Marriage ceremonies will not be performed until after April 30, 2020, subject to an emergency request approved by the Presiding Judge.

IMPLEMENTATION

All questions arising from the implementation of this Order shall be addressed to the Judge before whom the case is pending, who shall have complete discretion in determining the presence or absence of a bonafide emergency. Hearings will be held by video conferencing if at all possible


On cases which are set to a corresponding date, the Circuit Clerk of Ogle County will send notices to attorneys of record and self represented litigants of new dates.
